1. Introduction:

- a) The 17thMeeting of Teacher Education Approval Board (TEAB) was held on 23rdFebruary, 2017 in the Conference Hall, Room No. 112, C Wing, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi to discuss the proposal received from the State Government of Mizoram for implementation of the Teacher Education Scheme for the financial year 2017-18.
- b) The list of participants who attended the meeting is attached at Annexure-II.
- c) The TEAB presentation is attached at Annexure-III
- d) Ms. Anamika Singh, Deputy Secretary (TE) welcomed the participants and invited the State representatives led by Shri P. Lalchhuanga, Secretary School Education, Mizoram who shared some of the best practices in teacher education in the State.
- e) DS(TE) also informed the State that the Scheme of CSSTE has been facing shortage of funds and hence requested the State to prioritize their works for grant of funds. It was also informed that components like Civil Works, Contingency etc., would not be approved in this plan and maybe considered for approval only after receipt of additional grants under the scheme.
- f) State has been given additional funds of Rs. 213.45 Crore Under the 14th Finance Commission Award. State is urged to utilize some funds for the improvement of Teacher Education sector in the State.

Innovations/Best Practices of the State: 2.

- a) IT based Training Management System (TMS) developed locally and set up by the DIETs - (all DIETs)
- **b)** Digitization of Library using Library Management System (all DIETs)
- c) Hindi Training including spoken Hindi with Central Institute of Hindi, Agra

- e) Clearing backlog of untrained elementary school teachers. Memorandum of Collaboration signed with IGNOU and approved by NCTE
- f) As per the scheme, 26 (@ 26 per IASE x 1 IASEs) academic posts have to be sanctioned. The State Govt. has sanctioned 26 academic posts, and all 26 posts have been filled up, i.e. 0% vacancy.
- g) School and Teacher Education Curriculum have been redesigned based on new Norms and Standard of NCTE, 2014.

Appraisal Issues- 2017-18:

- a) Separate cadre for Teacher Educators is yet to be created.
- b) The State of Mizoram has 9869 unqualified teachers (6994 at Elementary Level & 2875 at Secondary Level).
- c) Organizational restructuring of SCERT is under process.
- d) As per the scheme 200 (@ 25 per DIET x 8 DIETs) academic posts has to be sanctioned. The State of Mizoram has sanctioned 200 Academic posts, and 161 posts are filled up, i.e. 19.5% vacancy.

- e) As per the scheme, 45 academic posts have to be sanctioned in SCERT. The State Govt. has sanctioned 52 and filled up only 41 Academic posts i.e. 08 % vacancy.
- f) Last TET was held on October 2016. Pass % in the test was 61.02 %.
- g) Out of a total intake capacity of 520 for D. El. Ed. students in DIETs, the actual enrolment is 445 i.e., 86%.

4. Commitments for the year 2017-18:

- a) State Govt. would prioritize filling up all existing vacancies of academic posts by the next academic session i.e., 2018-19.
- b) State Govt. would hold TET exams annually on a regular basis and would do the following analysis of the results of the TET:
 - Pass percentage of DIET students as against the overall State average.
 - Comparative picture of pass percentage of students in Govt. institutions as against students in Pvt. Institutions.

7. Actual releases by GoI during 2017-18

The amount provided by Ministry of Finance at BE 2017-18 under CSSTE is Rs. 480.00 crore. Against the above estimates, Central Government shall provide to the State Government of Rs.1695.17 lakhs as its share. The State would contribute Rs. 188.35 lakh as its State share matching the above Central Share as per the existing fund sharing pattern of CSSTE.

The State should provide for a separate budget head for the CSSTE Central Share in the State Budget. State should release/transfer the Central Share to State implementing Society within 15 days of its receipt in the State treasury. The State share should be released to the State Implementing society within one month of the release of the Central Share.
