- Intership programme is divided into 3 phases pre internship, internship and post internship covering 180 days i.e 1 Semester in total (3rd semester)
- Application for admission to both B.Ed and M.Ed Programmes have been increasing year after year. Number of application received in the last academic year for 120 seats in B.Ed Programme was 723. Number of applications for M.Ed Programme also increased year after year with all seats being filled up (50 seats) in the current academic session.
- There has been positive impact in terms of number of applicants and student intake.
